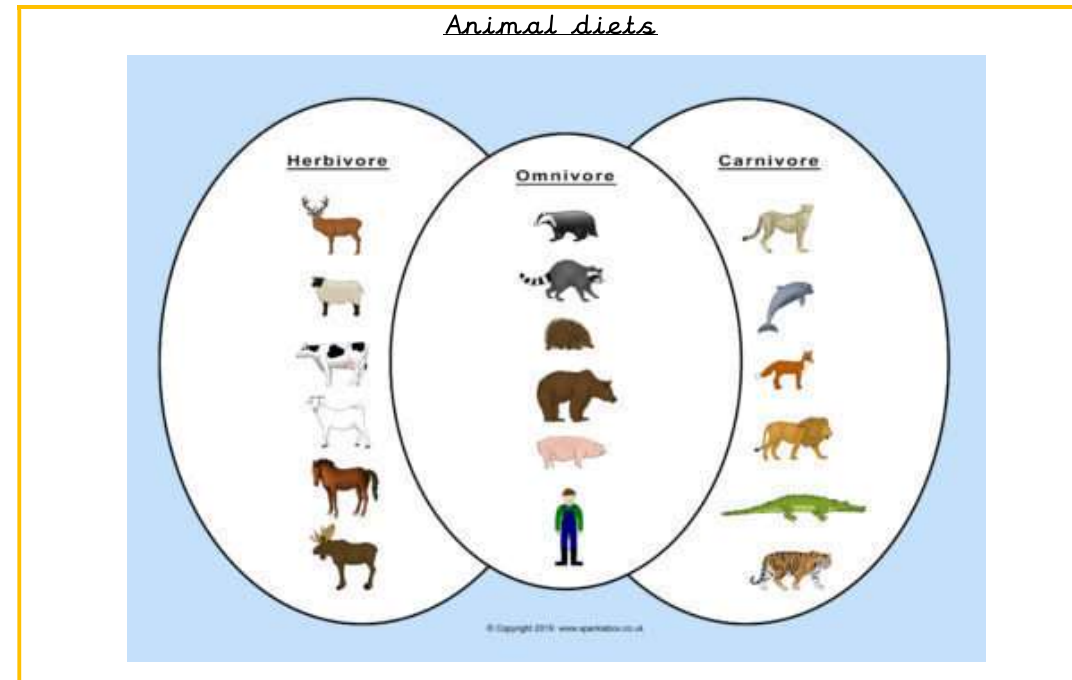
















Vocabulary	Key Knowledge
fish	Live and breathe underwater. Have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and breathe through gills.
amphibian	Born and live in water as babies with gills and tails, but live on land when older. Have smooth, slimy skin.
reptile	Cold-blooded animals that lay eggs and breathe air. Have hard, scaly skin.
bird	All have a beak, feathers and wings. Lay eggs and are warm blooded.
mammal	Animals that breathe air and are warm blooded. Grow hair or fur and have live babies that feed on their mother's milk.
carnivore	A meat-eating animal that gets its food from killing other animals.
herbivore	Animals that eat only plants.
omnivore	Animals that eat both plants and meat.
nocturnal	Animals that are active during the night time.
tame	Domesticated animals that are not frightened of or do not try to hurt humans.
wild	Animals that live in the natural environment and do not belong to humans.
