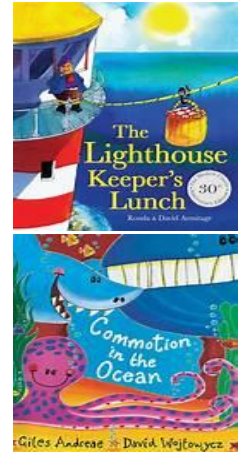




Foundation Stage News

Our new topic for this half term is 'Beside the Seaside.'

For the next coming weeks we are focussing on lighthouses and sea animals.

The book that will help us with our learning is 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch.' We will be writing a shopping list for the Lighthouse Keeper, Mr Grinling's lunch. It may include mustard sandwiches!

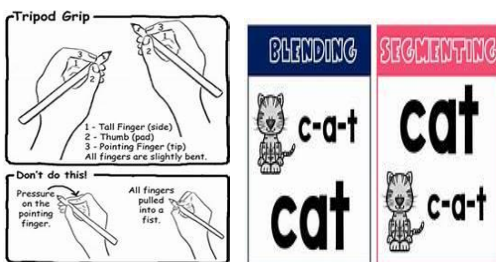
The other book we will use is 'Commotion in the Ocean.' We will write sentences to describe a range of sea animals.

The phonics we will be learning are:-

aj, ou, ie, ea, oy, ir, ue, aw

We are learning that two letters that make one sound are called 'digraphs'. We are also learning that three letters that make one sound are called 'trigraphs'.

We are working on using our letter sound knowledge independently in our reading and writing.



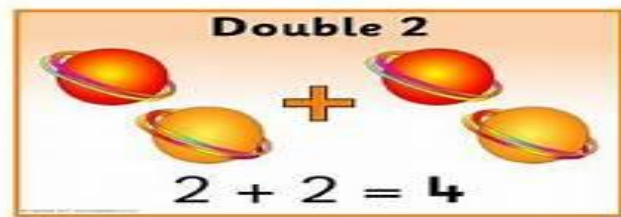

Maths:

In Maths we have been learning about 'doubling' and 'sharing and grouping'.

We have learnt that 'double' means 'twice as many'. We have been learning to add the double.



We will learn about 'sharing and grouping' by sharing out objects into equal groups and checking that everyone has the same amount.
